

Take Action to Stop TPP

- The best action you can take to prevent implementation of the Trans-Pacific Pact is to contact your Congressman and Senator and ask them to vote “NO” when the agreement comes up for a vote in Congress.

Below is an easy reference to make that contact. Congressmen require that you be a constituent to send an e-mail, and they give scant attention to any form of communication from a non-constituent. In the Senate, we are focusing on Senator Isakson because he is up for re-election this year. Be prepared to send a message several times as the measure makes its way through the approval process.

- Contact your friends and acquaintances and make sure they are weighing in with their elected representatives on this issue.
- Be alert for meetings where Tom Barksdale can speak on TPP along the lines of his presentation to a joint gathering of several groups on January 7. Tom can tailor the presentation to the time allocated to him.
